




Outcomes

- Innovation and Creativity: Encouraging 'ecopreneurship' and innovative thinking through experiential learning paves the way for students to approach problems creatively, a skill highly valued in university projects, research endeavours, and future career opportunities.

Student Pathway

After completing the one-year programme, students have several pathways to choose from, each offering unique opportunities for their future:



Pursue an A-Level, IBDP or Other Equivalent International Curriculum

Students may choose to pursue an A-Level or an equivalent international curriculum. This path offers robust support for university applications globally.

Stay in Switzerland and Study the Matura Curriculum

Alternatively, students can choose to stay in Switzerland to study the Matura curriculum and sit for the Matura examination. Successfully completing this path allows them to apply to any university in Switzerland, benefiting from top-tier education and rich academic experiences.

Return to the Original School with New Skills and Experience

Students also have the option to return to their original school, bringing back new skills and experiences gained from the program. This choice allows them to apply their newfound knowledge in their previous educational environment, further enhancing their personal growth and development.

No matter which path students choose, we are dedicated to supporting their growth and success, providing the resources and guidance needed to help them achieve their goals.

Interdisciplinary Electives

Taking inspiration from the Swiss natural environment, the Ignite: Switzer-land curriculum provides the perfect platform to embark on an exciting educational journey. This is an ideal opportunity for students to develop their passions, or try something new, as they select a personalised pathway through the electives.

Students choose one elective to study intensively for four hours a week. These electives culminate in a Passion Project, during which students present their work to their peers and teachers during the Ignite learning journey.



Understanding the Natural World

The natural world inspires us all. It underpins our economy, our society, indeed our very existence. Our forests, rivers, oceans, and soils provide us with the food we eat, the air we breathe, and the water we irrigate our crops with. As nature is free, we often take it for granted. Students



learn to appreciate the value of the natural world through a combination of academic study and practical experience. Students receive an introduction to the biodiversity of the region and the importance of conserving it. They explore how animals interact with their alpine environment and how animal behaviour is shaped by external factors and stimuli. Students learn how this is linked to the unique conservation model of the Swiss National Park, and they also learn how technology is being used to enhance conservation effectiveness. Eco-tourism is also being explored. There are numerous field trips to local farms, glaciers, and lakes.

Digital Photography

Photography has the power to inspire and lead change for the better. Students are guided through assorted styles and techniques of photography, which include landscape, street, wildlife, and aerial photography. Drones, smartphones and SLR cameras are used with Lightroom and



Adobe Photoshop as the software components. Exposure to diverse types of photography enable students to see what style interests them and they are encouraged to experiment in order to discover their own personal style. Visits to the Swiss National Park, the rivers, forest, villages and Tarasp Castle in Scuol complement the course.

Field to Table

This course focus on traditional and sustainable ways to process, preserve and package food in Switzerland. We look at how this can be done as naturally as possible, understanding how food scientist today maximise the flavour, longevity, and nutritional value of food. This is a very prac-



tical course and involves trips to farms, specialised food shops, and cooking tasty and nutritional meals. Sustainable agriculture and ingredient sourcing are an important part of food science. How are traditional Swiss products and dishes sourced around the school? By shopping for our meals on local farms and while preparing them, we discuss and analyse the regional food cycle, for example with regards to its CO2 value.

Travels in Geology (Term 1 & 3 only)

Geology is the branch of science that deals with the Earth, its materials, and its processes; it answers questions about how the Earth came to have its present shape and form. On this course students learn about the basic tectonic story behind the forces that have shaped



the Lower Engadine Valley, where HIF is situated. The complicated geology of the Alps is on full display along the valley's well-marked trails. This is a very practical course with equal time being spent in the classroom and hiking along the Engadine Valley. Students learn about the distinctive characteristics of upland, lowland and glaciated landscapes in the Valley and the impact the climate and humans are having on it. Students choose how they record what they are learning through the written word, sound recordings, drawings. Visiting the local silver mine is a highlight of the course.

Art & the Environment

Art generates individual and collective emotions that strengthens our connection to our natural world.

As the Lower Engadine Valley is also known as the Valley of Light, it provides the perfect immersive backdrop for students to embrace nature and study. The students learn how



this is linked to the unique conservation model of the Swiss National Park, and they also learn how technology is being used to enhance conservation effectiveness. The plethora of alpine flora and fauna within the immediate vicinity of the school enables students to do quick sketches or in-depth studies; the choice is theirs. Students also examine the relationship of people to natural and built environments by studying the landscape outside their windows, parks, and historic buildings further afield. They have opportunities to collaborate with local artists and learn techniques around colour, perspective, and composition. Field trips to the Swiss National Park, , and Tarasp Castle in Scuol are essential elements of the course.

Passion Project

The Passion Project offers students a chance to create a personal and creative outcome that showcases their learning at Ignite: Switzerland. These projects are centered around challenges that motivate and interest each student. They encourage practical exploration through inquiry, action, and reflection. Students independently develop their own projects, emphasising experiential learning. Completing a significant piece of work over time and reflecting on their learning and outcomes prepares students for future success. The Passion Project is assessed and included in the Ignite: Switzerland Report.







Co-Curricular Activities

To complement the academic programme, we offer a range of activities after school and at weekends that are designed to enhance the students' educational experience. Participation is mandatory in the evenings as this is a time for Ignite students to socialise and make new friends.

Some of the activities on offer are basketball, badminton, dancing, fitness training, volleyball, football, mahjong, cooking, hiking, mountain biking, indoor climbing, open gym and table tennis.



Wellbeing Curriculum

Wellbeing integrates five elements of Wellbeing: Emotional, Academic, Social, Physical, and Mental Health.

Ignite: Switzerland's Wellbeing Curriculum is based around these five pillars and aims to support and enhance the wellbeing of its community. The Programme includes an explicitly taught Health and Wellbeing course for all students, supplemented by the outdoor programme and experiential learning.

In these classes, the students are taught how their body and brain can be optimised for their own personal and academic growth. They learn about the importance of sleep, approaches to manage stress response, emotional literacy, culture creation and ways to preventatively and reactively support their mental health. These lessons serve to underpin their day-to-day learning in the outdoor programme and residential living.



It helps them manage homesickness, approach challenges and overcome big emotions while on the programme but most importantly it sets them up for success beyond Ignite equipping them with tools, they can access during their further education. The students also learn that everyone is responsible for their own wellbeing as well as that of those around them.



Ignite: Switzerland offers a breadth of opportunities to students to help provide a powerful learning experience. The unique experiences undoubtedly stand out in the students' memories. The alpine environment offers a variety of exciting, challenging, and easily accessible sports and activities for all.

With the Swiss National Park and the southern alpine peaks on our doorstep, the students can walk from the school out into the most beautiful of surroundings. The students develop confidence and resilience in the outdoors that enable them to take leadership roles in other aspects of their lives in the future.




Our expedition programme is designed to utilise the power of the outdoors to foster personal growth and provide a genuine education through adventurous experiences. Excursions

A one-week trip is planned in each term of Ignite: Switzerland, offering the option to explore Switzerland, Germany and Austria. Assessment & Reporting

Subjects are assessed on a termly basis, and at the end of each term families will receive an overview of achievement and progress, including targets for development. At the end of the year students will receive an overall report outlining their academic and personal growth and overall achievement. This will be shared via our online portal – Kinteract.

The Passion Project is assessed by each student's mentor, and comments are included in the student's report. The Ignite: Switzerland report is issued in Switzerland, and students will receive it before departing. These reports can also be shared with home schools if necessary.

Ensuring Excellence and Safety in Faculty Recruitment

Ignite: Switzerland strictly adheres to relevant policies and procedures, ensuring that every step of teacher recruitment and quality control considers the protection of students' safety.

Comprehensive Background Checks and Verification

Background checks and verification for faculty and staff include:

- Legitimate identification documents (ID card or passport).
- Degree certificates certified by professional organisations.
- Teacher qualification certificates certified by the original country.
- No criminal record in all countries of residence in the past 10 years.
- Written and oral background checks from three former school heads.





Rigorous Application Screening Process

Well-trained recruiters carefully review each application form and resume. During the screening process, if there are doubts about the resume or if there are unclear descriptions of experiences, recruiters will follow up and verify. Resumes with issues will be screened out.



Clear and Concise Child Safeguarding Statement

On the recruitment website and in each job description, there will be a clear and concise "Child Safeguarding Statement", which will detail the responsibilities and obligations that our faculty and staff should fulfill in terms of child protection.

Mandatory Child Safeguarding Training

Before any employee comes into contact with students, we arrange relevant child safeguarding training, and review the training content annually, providing retraining for employees.



Safeguarding

Every child, regardless of age, has at all times and in all situations a right to feel safe and protected from any situation or practice that may result in their being physically or emotionally affected. The primary responsibility is to ensure the care, welfare and safety of the children in our charge. In order to achieve this, all staff and volunteers in the school, in whatever capacity, are at all times proactive in child welfare matters, especially where there is a possibility that a child may be at risk of harm. An open and accepting attitude towards children is adopted as part of our responsibility for pastoral care. The aim is to create an environment where students feel free to talk about any concerns and view our school as a safe place, whether the issues arise within or outside of school.



Hoch alpines Institute Ftan (HIF) is home to Ignite: Switzerland, located above the village of Ftan (altitude: 1648 metres) in a beautiful alpine setting in south-eastern Switzerland. The region borders on Italy and Austria. The local community comprises the village of Ftan (population n500), the nearby town of Scuol (population 2,500) and other villages in the region of the Lower Engadin. HIF is attended by students from the local region of the Lower Engadin and by boarding students from Switzerland and around the world.

HIF shares proximity to the Swiss National Park, Switzerland's only national park. Students are encouraged to become stewards of the beautiful surroundings they find themselves in. It is hoped that it inspires them to explore its wildlife, mountains, forest, pastures, and rivers.









Boarding Life


Boarding offers so many opportunities to gain independence, confidence, and make lifelong friendships.

Meals


The Ignite: Switzerland Programme takes full advantage of HIF's first-rate facilities and stunning surroundings.



Digital Devices

Students are not encouraged to bring a wide range of digital devices to Ignite: Switzerland, although it is accepted that technology is part of our lives. Offer

Fees
